Air Quality in Wales

- AQ in Wales is a high priority for Welsh Government.
- We are committed to tackling the sources of pollution and ensuring people's right to clean air.

 Our driver is not only European legislation, but our commitment to protect human health and the

environment.





Air Quality Challenges

- Currently 39 AQMAs within Wales 11 LAs
- Particulate issues in Port Talbot
- Nickel in Pontardawe above target value
- Modelled B[a]P exceedences in South Wales and Swansea zones
- Ecosystems: deposition on sensitive habitats sites

Changes at a national level

- Review of Air Quality Incident Response in Wales
 - Following Fforestfach incident, Wales Resilience Forum concerned that there were potential gaps in the response mechanisms
 - capabilities across Welsh Local Authorities were better in some places than in others
 - Wales Resilience Partnership Team (WRPT) tasked WG with leading a task and finish group to review response provisions (includes PHW, PHE CRCE, NRW and LAs)
 - Findings and recommendations accepted by WRPT, including Local Resilience Fora
 - Aim to provide clear expectations and maximise resources nationally

Consistent with complementary reviews

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EC Air Quality Policy Review

- Air Quality Legislation in the UK that derives from the EU consists of:
 - The Ambient Air Quality Directive
 - The National Emissions Ceilings Directive
 - Source control legislation
- Review conclusions published in December 2013



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EC Air Quality Policy Review

- 1. A Clean Air Programme for Europe provides the framework for AQ policy until 2030
- 2. Proposal to repeal and replace 2001 NECD
 - New stricter ceilings for SO2, NOx, NH3, NMVOC for 2020 and 2030
 - Proposal also covers PM2.5 from 2020 and CH4 from 2030
- 3. Proposal for a Medium Combustion Plant Directive
 - Regulate emissions from plants between
 - 1 50 MWth input
- 4. Recommendation to ratify the amended Gothenburg protocol agreed in 2012

NO₂ Compliance

- Wales has 4 zones for assessment under AQD
- In recognition of the significant challenge of reducing NO₂ levels, the AQD allowed MS to apply for a time extension until 2015
- 3 / 4 zones granted a time extension: North Wales zone, Cardiff urban area and Swansea urban area
- Solutions require both national and local measures

SWANSEA NOWCASTER PROJECT

Variable traffic signs with messages linked to real-time air quality prediction system

- Three variable road signs installed in 2012/13, focusing on the deprived Hafod AQMA
- Effectiveness of the system has yet to be evaluated –
 Welsh Government unlikely to provide further funding until method is proven effective in averting potential air quality objective exceedences in pilot area






NAVIGATION COLLIERY SITE REGENERATION

2014/15

Tidy Towns

- Merged with TGCP to encourage integrated projects with multiple benefits tailored to an area's needs
- Improving local environment quality (LEQ) should be the primary purpose of any project
- LEQ issues include (but are not limited to):
 litter, graffiti, chewing gum, antisocial behaviour,
 air pollution, environmental noise and
 inadequate provision of high quality accessible
 green space
- Projects must help to improve the quality of life of those suffering from deprivation

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 or regenerate the environment in deprived communities

2014/2015 OVER 50 PROJECTS FUNDED INCLUDING OFF-ROAD ACTIVE TRAVEL ROUTES IN...

- Anglesey coastal path
- Blaenau Gwent pedestrian routes to local nature reserves
- Denbighshire green infrastructure improvements for Rhyl
- NPT canal towpath from Neath town centre to Tonna
- BUT
- No air quality specific grant applications received this year!
- Next bidding round expected in early 2015...
